'Time' and 'Life' and later he wrote a book with another former Time-Life correspondent, ARMA LLE JACOBY called 'Thunder Out Of China.' WHITE also edited General STILWELL's memoirs which were published as the 'Stilwell Papers.' WHITE is in France at the present time as a correspondent of the Overseas News Agency."

LOUIS F. RUDEWZ, former managing editor of the Daily Worker, an East Coast Communist newspaper, said he heard and read in official Communist reports by Communist Party functionaries that ONE LATTIMORE had been given assignments by the Communist Party in 1937-1944.

Confidential Informant Boston T-6, of known reliability, stated that on January 22, 1946, the Massachusetts Citizens Political Action Committee held a meeting at Tremont Temple in Boston, at which time the principal speakers were THEODORE WHITE, 'HILL', JAFFE, ANDREW ROTH, and Congressman HUGH DE LACY. T-6 stated that at one time THEODORE WHITE was at least a Communist Party sympathizer. According to T-6, THEODORE WHITE in his speech at Boston described the miserable conditions under which the Chinese people lived and declared these conditions were naturally creative of revolutions. T-6 also said that in his speech WHITE mentioned that this revolution was being led by the free agents, that is, the Chinese 8th Route Army or Communist movement. T-6 also said that WHITE declared in his speech that the Revolution would occur and accomplish all of its objectives were it not for the unwarranted interference of the United States troops and Japanese mercenaries, under the direction of the United States leaders. T-6 further related that THEODORE WHITE in his speech called for an immediate withdrawal of American forces from China and a policy of noninterference in Chinese international affairs on the part of the U. S. Department of State.

Confidential Informant Boston T-6 was recontacted and related that since 1946, he has not seen or heard anything concerning THEODORE WHITE. T-6 stated he would not furnish a signed statement and will not appear before a loyalty hearing board.

Confidential Informant Boston T-7, of known reliability, stated that in no place in the program of the Massachusetts Citizens Political Action Committee does it depart from the Communist Party line except that it is not quite so revolutionary in tone.
