Dear Governor Schwarzenegger,

We are aware that severe budget shortfalls are forcing you to consider the indefinite closure of units of the State Park system that will result in cessation of recreation opportunities available to both state residents and visitors alike. The purpose of this letter is to alert you that closures affecting state park facilities that have received assistance from the Federal Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) State Grant Program could jeopardize future reimbursements and funding under this program. Likewise, closures effecting properties conveyed to the State under the Federal Lands to Parks Program (FLP) could result in reversion of the property to federal ownership for re-disposal.

My office is willing to work closely with you and your staff as you consider budget cuts and park closures. Often, measures exist short of park closures which will allow a State to remain in LWCF and FLP program compliance. We are willing to explore these options should the need arise. Early coordination and the identification of mutually acceptable cost reduction measures for LWCF-assisted and FLP conveyed sites will ensure the successful continuation of our long-standing partnership and, more importantly, assure the continued availability to the recreating public of quality outdoor recreation facilities and resources.

The LWCF State grant program is a long-standing State-Federal-Local partnership program administered by the National Park Service and by State Departments of Parks and Recreation. Since 1965, this program has provided almost \$3.7 billion in financial assistance to States, Territories, the District of Columbia and local units of government for the acquisition and development of public outdoor recreation areas and facilities. This has amounted to over 40,400 grants to state and local governments. California has received approximately \$286 million in LWCF assistance, affecting 67 of the state parks listed on the potential closure list.

The State's commitment under the Land and Water Conservation Fund program is reflected in each grant agreement it executes with NPS, in which it agrees to preserve, protect and increase the quality and quantity of public outdoor recreation facilities and resources, consistent with the intent of the LWCF, as amended.

The State also provides assurances as to its ability to effectively operate and maintain the facilities acquired or developed by the LWCF project, that (1) it shall not convert any Fund-assisted areas to other than public outdoor recreation use without the approval of the Secretary of the Interior as set forth in Section 6(f)(3) of the Act (P. L. 88-578, 16 U.S.C 460l-8), and, (2) such areas shall be maintained in public outdoor recreation use in perpetuity. Compliance responsibilities are specified in Federal Regulations at 36 CFR §59.


Should Fund-assisted State park sites be closed resulting in the cessation of recreation activities, a significant decrease in both the quality and quantity of public outdoor recreation facilities available will result. Such a reduction is inconsistent with the intent of the Act and in conflict with the provisions of the contract between the State and the Federal Government. Secretary of the Interior Ken Salazar is requesting that the Land and Water Conservation Fund be restored to its full funding level of \$900 million, half of which would be for the state assistance side of the program. The closure of State Parks will jeopardize the State's future apportionment. As you are aware, your state parks also support local business activity and generate tax revenues.

Lands conveyed to the State under the Federal Lands to Parks Program (Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, as amended (63 Stat. 377; 40 USC §550), must be open for public park and recreation use in perpetuity as a condition of the deed. Any parkland thus conveyed, if it is found to be unavailable to the public for park and recreation use, may revert to federal ownership for re-disposal. We have identified 6 such park areas on the proposed closure list, including the recently transferred Fort Ord Dunes State Park.

The National Park Service stands by the Land and Water Conservation Fund and Federal Lands to Parks Programs as important extensions of our core mission, and will work with you to protect the public's recreation estate in these challenging times. The public has no less need for recreational opportunities and access to open space in times of economic hardship. If anything, the need for such recreational opportunities is greater now, not only due to leaner economic times but also because of the increasing personal, community, and environmental health issues associated with more sedentary lifestyles and lack of contact with nature.

By working together we can find ways to insure that the LWCF and FLP program requirements are being met and still provide you with as much flexibility as possible to deal with shortfalls in funding short of park closures.
