I. BIOGRAPHICAL DATA

Birth

The records of the Bureau of Vital Statistics, Providence, Rhode Island, reflected that an unnamed male child was born June 4, 1920, in Jamestown, Rhode Island, the son of Charles Russell Train and Errol Cuthbert Train.

Education

The appointee has the following educational record:

Princeton University, Princeton, New Jersey. He was graduated from the Politics Department and was awarded an A.B. degree on June 17, 1941. He ranked 370th in a class of 488. His record indicated that he persistently disregarded attendance warnings and his parents were advised of his "class cuts." He was suspended indefinitely on May 10, 1940, (he was reinstated on May 13, 1940) for participating in a "typical college prank." The school records reflected that during the early morning hours of May 6, 1940, Mr. Train and another student were returning to the school after having spent the evening in a local bar. They took a fifty-pound bag of wheat from a mill along the route and they were arrested by the Princeton Township Police Department, Princeton, New Jersey, for disorderly conduct.
