

# Epilogue

In 1978 a large team of researchers went to Turin, Italy to study the Shroud of Turin. This team was given more than five days of access to examine the Shroud and collect data. The result of this examination and subsequent data analysis can be found in the manuscript *The Shroud: A critical summary of observations, data and hypotheses*, from the Turin Shroud Center of Colorado, under the auspices of the Shroud of Turin Research Project (STURP). This tome lays out evidence in the following areas: historical, medical forensic, fabric analysis, image characteristics, image formation hypothesis, image characterization, and dating of the Shroud.
