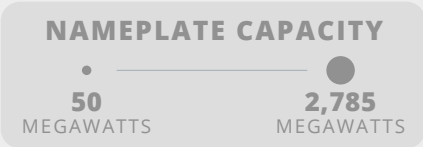


- Retiring coal and nuclear plants
- Retiring coal and nuclear plants within 25 miles of one or more military installation

This square highlights a power plant-military base case study.

The larger of the two red circles in New Jersey marks Oyster Creek nuclear reactor and its near neighbor, Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. Oyster Creek closed in September, leaving the base and the state more dependent on gas-fired power plants along the border with Pennsylvania.

The Energy Department says pipeline-supplied gas generation is less secure than coal or nuclear plants with their on-site fuel. But many plants within 50 miles of Joint Base are still running, connected to its redundant transmission networks.
