## A BILL

To remove from the John H. Chafee Coastal Barrier Resources System areas included in Florida System Unit P-16, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. REMOVAL FROM JOHN H. CHAFEE COASTAL**  
4                       **BARRIER RESOURCES SYSTEM OF AREAS IN-**  
5                       **CLUDED IN FLORIDA SYSTEM UNIT P-16.**

6       The Secretary of the Interior shall revise maps re-  
7       ferred to in section 4(a) of the Coastal Barrier Resources

1 Act (16 U.S.C. 3503(a)) as necessary to remove from  
2 Florida System Unit P-16—

3 (1) the area known as Royal Marco Point on  
4 Marco Island, Collier County, Florida; and

5 (2) the area known as La Peninsula of the Isles  
6 of Capri in Naples, Collier County, Florida.

7 **SEC. 2. AVAILABILITY OF INSURANCE UNDER THE NA-**  
8 **TIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM FOR**  
9 **AREAS REMOVED FROM FLORIDA SYSTEM**  
10 **UNIT P-16.**

11 Section 1316 of the National Flood Insurance Act of  
12 1968 (42 U.S.C. 4023) shall not apply with respect to a  
13 property located in an area described in paragraph (1) or  
14 (2) of section 1 unless—

15 (1) the Administrator of the Federal Emer-  
16 gency Management Agency determines that such  
17 property would have been declared by a duly con-  
18 stituted State or local zoning authority, or other au-  
19 thorized public body, to be in violation of State or  
20 local laws, regulations, or ordinances as described in  
21 such section 1316 without regard to whether section  
22 1 of this Act had been in effect at the time of the  
23 declaration by such State or local zoning authority  
24 or such other authorized public body; or

1           (2) after the date of the enactment of this Act,  
2           a duly constituted State or local zoning authority, or  
3           other authorized public body, finds such property to  
4           be in violation of State or local laws, regulations, or  
5           ordinances described in such section 1316.
